Dear WAGS Members,

Our next (and last!) championship match for the Wilsthorpe Amateur Golf Society 2018 season is, **Norwood golf club on Sunday** 7th **October 2018**, arrival time 10:45am.

Don't forget to check if you are listed as playing in the next match on the society website. This can be done by selecting the "Latest Info" tab on the home page of the website, then select the "Match Attendance" button.

So, this is now the business end of the season and I have no doubt that quite a few of you have had a look at the championship table on the society website. If we take all the points at present based on the best 5 games from 7 games, we have the top three members only separated by just 5 points, with the top 5 only separated by 13 points. One good round or one bad round good greatly effect the results for the WAGS 2018 Champion, not to put too much pressure on anyone ②. With this in mind, I could not help myself running a few scenarios through the computer, just to see what would happen!!

- 1st Scenario: If Ash Hutchinson were to score 36 points and Shane Dellow scored no more than 30 points and Danny Fletcher scored no more than 31 points, then Ash would be champion. This is assuming that Graham Hofmann does not score more than 37 points and Daniel Keen does not score over 43 points!
- 2nd Scenario: If Shane Dellow were to score 34 points, then Danny Fletcher would need to score more than 35 and Ash Hutchinson would need to score more than 39 points, assuming that both Graham Hofmann and Daniel Keen do not break in to the mid-40's, then Shane would be the 2018 champion.
- 3rd Scenario: If Danny Fletcher were to card 36 points, then Shane Dellow would need to card more than 35 points and Ash Hutchinson would need to card more than 40 points for Danny not to be crowned the 2018 champion. In this scenario both Graham Hofmann and Daniel Keen would have to card a bucket load of points!! Over 42 and 48 points respectively.
- 4th Scenario: This is more of an outside chance, but a chance nevertheless, if Graham Hofmann was to score 36 points and Shane Dellow did not score more than 28 points, Danny Fletcher did not score more than 29 points, Ash Hutchinson did not score more than 33 points and Daniel Keen did not card any more than 41 points. Then it would be Graham crowned 2018 champion!

As I said, these are all possible scenarios, who knows what will happen at Norwood golf club, but I am sure it might be a more tense round of golf for some members more than others. All the best gentlemen in your quest for glory. I have attached these scenarios at the end of the newsletter!!




October Doubles Cup - Rufford Park G.C.: Sunday 16th September 2018
