Congratulations to all the winners of prizes on the day.

Now the only piece of business left on the day was to do the draw for the pairs competition. Our Captain had decided that it would not

be split in to seeded and un-seeded players either. I gave Graham all the members scorecards, he shuffled them and we were ready for the draw......

1st out was Jordan Hughes, scoring 32 points individually. So Jordan would be partnered with..... well the next member drawn was Daniel Keen. Daniel had scored 27 points, so their pairs total was 59 points. Not a bad bench mark for the 1st pairs drawn. Next drawn was Dave Johnstone with 24 points. Dave was then drawn with Paul Bacon, with Paul scoring 23 points that gave them a pairs total of 47. So Jordan & Daniel were still leading in the clubhouse after 2 draws!! Next drawn was Andrew Shilton, scoring 25 points. Andrew was then drawn with Ges Meehan, who in turn had scored 29 points. So Andrew and Ges had a pairs total of 54, enough to take them ahead of Dave & Paul, but not quite enough to take the lead at this time, leaving them 5 behind Jordan & Daniel.

Next to be drawn was Steve Roulstone, with 19 points. Graham then pulled out Ash Hutchinson with 24 points to pair up with Steve, giving them a total of 43 points. Quite a way off the lead pair on 59 points ③. Daniel O'Hanlon was drawn out next, with 23 points. On 28 points Mick Fullwood was drawn out as Daniel's partner, giving them a total of 51 points. This made Daniel & Mick 3rd after 5 pairs had been drawn, with the 1st pairing of Jordan & Daniel leading on 59 points. Graham gave the cards another shuffle and then drew Stuart Prescott out, with 27 points. Next out was Shane Dellow with 36 points, giving Stuart & Shane a pairs total of 63 and taking the lead by 4 points from Jordan & Daniel. So 6 pairs now drawn and the lead had changed hands for the first time since the first pair hand been drawn. This left only 5 pairs to be drawn, could Stuart & Shane hold on to their lead?

Graham then drew Mick O'Hanlon out with 32 points, who was then drawn with Robbie Kerr as a pairing. Robbie Kerr scored 16 points giving Mick & Robbie a total of 48 points, just beating Steve & Ash by 5 points to avoid being bottom at this stage of the draw. Next to be drawn was Glen Hundleby, with 33 points. Jason was next to be drawn with 30 points, giving Glen & Jason a pairs total of 63 points to take the joint lead with Stuart & Shane.

So after 8 pairs drawn and only 3 left to be drawn, there was a tie at the top on 63 points by Stuart & Shane and Glen & Jason. Graham then drew himself out, now scoring 39 points by himself, most members would have liked to be drawn with Graham. It was at this point our chairman Mick O'Hanlon interceded and declared he would draw Graham's partner, as he didn't want him getting Ian Patrick, who had also had a good round of golf at Sinfin. So Mick made the draw and....... Oh yes, you have guessed already haven't you, who did Mick draw as Graham partner? Correct, Mick drew Ian as Graham's partner, you couldn't make it up ©. Ian himself had scored 30 points, giving Graham & Ian a points total of 69 points and taking the outright lead by 6 points.


