I will be confirming the numbers with Rufford Park on Saturday 27th April, so if you are not down to play and wish to do so, please let me know by then!!

Our Captain for the 2013 season, Mr Ian Patrick wanted to play a course that was new to the WAGS for his Captain's Day and choose Rufford Park. It is a total of 6,022 yards from the men's yellow pots, with a par of 70. The first hole is a par 4, 361 yards, a steady hole to get you nice and limbered up!! Holes on the course range from the 7th hole par 3, 147 yards, stroke index 16, to the long par 5 13th hole, 589 yards, stroke index 1. But I think it might be the par 3 17th hole at 169 yards, stroke index 9 that will have every WAGS member talking back in the clubhouse. The tee is elevated (very elevated!!) giving you a near birds-eye view of the 17th green. From this vantage point it is quite easy to see the water surrounding nearly all of the front half of the green. Oh yes, just about 180 degrees of the green is surrounded by water!!! Gentlemen, have fun on this hole ☺
