I will confirm all those shown above as playing at The Manor, if you are not listed and want to play please let me know as soon as, because as it stands now I am only booking the match for those 18 members listed above.

So the next match is at The Manor, I am sure a fair few of you will agree, it can be quite a challenging course, but also a picturesque course. The course at The Manor has a par of 71 and is a total of 5,886 yards long from the yellow tees. The holes vary from the short par 3 13th hole at 126 yards, stroke index 18, to the mammoth par 5, 628 yard, stroke index 1, 3rd hole. I think you could say that there is something there for everyone ©.

As is now the norm at Lichfield Golf Club we take part in a little warm up in the morning, before playing 18 holes for the Memorial Trophy in the afternoon. The warm up consisted of 9 holes around the par 3 Spires Course. As they were all obviously par three's we decided just to award a prize for the 'Nearest the Pin' on the 1st and 9th holes only. 20 WAGS members and 4 guests set off on the warm up 9 holes, our Captain Graham Hofmann, informed us all that all we needed to do was write down our gross stroke play for each hole, calculations would then be done later to determine the winner, as no stroke indices were shown on the scorecard.

If you are ready I will try and explain the complex trigonometry calculations that went in to determining the winner of the par 3 course. Well we just stuck a pin in the scorecards face down! No, no, no, just joking ©, we didn't do that, but that is worth thinking about ©

The calculations went as thus: -

Firstly, each player had their full handicap divided by three. If your handicap is 21, then it became 7. But, if your handicap was 16, then 16 divided by 3 is 5.33, this would be rounded down to 5. However, if your handicap was 8, then 8 divided by 3 is 2,66, this would be rounded up to 3. Hopefully that explains what your handicap was for the 9 hole Spire course would be.

Next I had to allocate a stroke index to each of the 9 holes.

Nothing complicated here, I did the straight forward and simple theory, the shortest hole was allocated a stroke index of 9 and the longest hole was allocated a stroke index of 1. With all the other

holes falling in line according to the hole length. Once the stroke

indices had been allocated to all the holes, it was just a matter of deducting those from each of the players gross scores and hey presto, I could then calculate everybody's points total. Hopefully you haven't fallen asleep and you actually understood all that ③.

Around the 9 hole Spires course we carded a total of 76 gross bogeys' and 40 gross pars. Those with multiple gross pars of note were, Mick O'Hanlon, Daniel Keen and Charlie Shilton, all of whom carded 5 gross pars. But we did have one gross birdie, that was achieved by Paul Ormond on the 8th hole, at 100 yards. Well done to all you gentlemen, especially Paul, well done.



It was our Chairman Mick O'Hanlon. Gentlemen well played, especially to Mick, great result.




