

Dear WAGS Members,

So, we have now finished our championship season, but there is still the Winter Cup and Presentation Evening to look forward to on Saturday 3rd November 2018, at Morley Hayes.

I will be chasing you all in the next couple of weeks if you have not already let me know that you wish to play in the Winter Cup and attend the presentation evening.

I have the great pleasure in being able to tell all the members that have played in 3 matches during the season or more, that your Winter Cup/Presentation Evening will be subsidised by £20 each. Yes, I did say £20!! After a committee discussion we have looked at our finances and realised that we have sufficient funds to be able to make such a great gesture. However, to be clear, you must have played in three matches throughout the 2018 season. If you went on the away weekend to Forest Pines, that will count as your qualification. I am sure you can understand the committee's decision in making this little clause, as it will then benefit those who have contributed to the society over the 2018 season.

The Winter Cup and Presentation Evening full price is £50.00, so for those members qualifying for the subsidy it will now only be £30.00. How can you not attend the Winter Cup now with it being at nearly half price! Additional guests for the presentation evening will be charged at the same rate as last year, that is £25.00 for the three-course meal at Morley Hayes, which I do believe is great value for money considering the quality of food at Morley Hayes.

After what I felt was a little bit of a disappointing turn out at last years Winter Cup and Presentation Evening at Morley Hayes, hopefully the membership can greatly improve on the number attending this year.

As the match at Norwood Park progressed I thought it could be fun to do a little bit of statistic crunching. I will project the possible total points score for each of the top six members in the championship as they progress around Norwood Park. So, after the first six holes, were any of the top five challenges improving their position. The championship would look like this: -



1	Shane Dellow	11 pts	projected total = 33 pts	Best 6 of $8 = 198$
2	Daniel Keen	14 pts	projected total = 42 pts	Best 6 of $8 = 194$
3	Graham Hofmann	10 pts	projected total = 30 pts	Best 6 of $8 = 188$
4	Danny Fletcher	6 pts	projected total = 18 pts	Best 6 of $8 = 185$
5	Ash Hutchinson	8 pts	projected total = 24 pts	Best 6 of $8 = 185$
6	Robbie Kerr	9 pts	projected total = 27 pts	Best 6 of $8 = 178$

I hope you all follow that ③.

Based on the first 6 holes of each player, the projected total would be their score after 18 holes if they kept scoring at the same rate as the first six holes. This would then give the championship best 6 of 8 as shown above. So, after the first six holes, the projection shows that at that rate Shane Dellow would be champion. The biggest mover was Daniel Keen, moving up from 5th place to second place, but also now only within 4 points of Shane.

But taking the title of "King of the Heap" at Norwood was Daniel Keen who carded an outstanding 10 gross pars. I had the pleasure of playing with Daniel, who started his round with 8 gross pars in the first 9 holes. I think Daniel was certainly on a mission to give it his best shot at trying to take his second title. Gentlemen very well played.

Gentlemen very well played, especially Robbie who went a little greedy carding two!!




Some members just cannot resist once they see a camera!!

6	Robbie Kerr	17 pts	projected total = 25 pts	Best 6 of $8 = 176$
