For anyone wanting to loosen up before we play, Beedles Lake does have a driving range that is open at 7:00am, with a basket of 60 balls costing £3.00. Along with the buggies costing just £15.00, I think the course offers good value for money. Meanwhile, our Captain, Graham Hofmann was doing his best to show solidarity for the more feminine colours (albeit not actually pink ©) and the girls game....


Mind you, given the face Graham seems to be making, he may well have just passed that particular signage!!

Now talking of double bogeys and bogeys, how did the 22 members do with regard to carding gross Par's? Well last season at Rufford Park 20 WAGS members carded a total of 79 gross pars. And this year we carded 76 gross par's at Rufford Park. However, with 22 WAGS members in attendance this year the average went down even more. Last season it worked out at 3.95 gross pars per member, if 20 WAGS members had played this year the average would have been 3.80. But with 22 members playing the average dropped to 3.45. 


I always think of golf as an enjoyable game and judging by the grin on Daniel Keen's face, he must think the same as me.
