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#### November singles Cup – Springwater G.C. : Sunday 1st October 2017

All too quickly the last championship game of the season seems to have arrived, where does the season go to? One moment we are all getting ready to tee off in the Silver Ferret and before you know it, we are all talking about the season's away weekend in the past tense, then we all stand on the tee box for the last championship match. However, believe it or not, it has been 173 days since we stood on the tee box at Ruddington Grange for this season's Silver Ferret! But we are now down to the business end of the season, with 5 members within 10 points of each other for the 2017 WAGS Championship. In reverse order these were: -

All these points were based on the best 5 results from 7 matches.				

20 members arrived ready to play at Springwater, where unfortunately there had been quite a lot of water overnight. So much so, the buggies had been withdrawn from service, so it was shanks' pony for everyone. The WAGS members would go out to do battle in five groups of four, with the top five in the championship going out in different groups. 5<sup>th</sup> place would go out first, then 4<sup>th</sup> place, then third, until finally the current leader Daniel O'Hanlon would go out in the final group..... ooooh, all rather exciting, I can feel the tense building already (3)

As is common, all the members got that final putting tweaking done before making their way to the first tee box to listen to our 2017 Captain Daniel Keen for his final championship speech of the season.

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Now I had said it had been raining a little overnight, but it seems in places it was a case of pointing the electric trolley in the right direction, switch on the power, then run around the lake covering the path hoping to grab your trolley on the other side to switch the power off again!!

With five holes played at Springwater, how were the top five contenders fairing in their quest for glory? Well, Daniel Keen had 10 points after 5 holes, which meant at that current scoring rate, the statistics estimated the points total for the round would be 36. Dave Johnstone had scored 9 points after 5 holes, giving him an estimated total of 32. Mick Fullwood and Mick O'Hanlon both had 8 points after 5 holes, which the statistics estimated would be a points total of 29. Daniel O'Hanlon had carded 11 points after 5 holes, therefore the statistics estimated a total points of 40. Would that total be enough for Daniel to hold on to the championship lead and claim his first title?

All the members at Springwater continued navigating their way around the course, which in places it must be said, was a little water-logged, but all the greens seemed in good condition. So, no excuse for letting that title slip away!!

The society had just pasted the half way stage of the match and finished the 10<sup>th</sup> hole. Daniel Keen was now on 22 points, giving him an estimated statistical total of 40 points for the complete round. Dave Johnstone was on 20 points after 10 holes, giving him an estimated 36 points total. Mick Fullwood was on 19 points after 10, which meant an estimated total of 34 points. While both Mick O'Hanlon and Daniel O'Hanlon had 19 points after 10 holes, giving them an estimated 34 points total. It seems Daniel O'Hanlon's estimated point total had slipped by 6 shots. Would this now be the chance that one of the other members was hoping for? One final push and maybe they could pip Daniel to the championship over the last few holes of the last match of the season!



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Now I am not saying Graham Hofmann's tee shot was off line, but we were not sure if his ball had made one of those holes in the roof in that barn in the distance! It turns out Graham's ball had indeed clattered straight in to the somewhat dilapidated brickwork of the barn, although we were not sure if it rebounded or went straight through!!

15 holes had now been played in the last championship match of the season, with both Daniel Keen and Mick Fullwood now on 29 points, which was estimated statistically to be a points total of 35. Dave Johnstone had moved on to 27 points after 15 holes, which meant an estimated total of 32 points. And yet again Mick O'Hanlon and Daniel O'Hanlon were tied, this time on 26 points after 15 holes, giving them both an estimated statistical points total of 32 points. With time running out, would this be enough for Daniel O'Hanlon to grab that championship firmly with both hands?

Although there was the championship battle in full swing, there was also the matter of who would be crowned 'Top of the Heap' for gross pars in the last championship match of the season? Well the 20 members carded a grand total of 78 gross pars, a very good total indeed. Those members who carded multiple gross pars were Michael Riley, Andrew Shilton, Robbie Kerr and Dave Johnstone, all who carded a creditable 5 gross pars. Carding one better, with a respectable 6 gross pars were Charlie Shilton and Mick O'Hanlon. Daniel O'Hanlon and Graham Hofmann went one better again, each carding an impressive 7 gross pars. But for the last time in the 2017 championship season the title of 'Top of the Heap' goes to Daniel Keen, who carded an excellent 8 gross pars at Springwater.

The round of golf was coming to completion at Springwater and the contenders were making their way over the water at the Par 3, 178 yard, 18<sup>th</sup> hole. Would their efforts on the day be enough to take the WAGS 2017 Championship? First in the clubhouse was our Captain and 1-time Champion Daniel Keen, who carded 35 points in the clubhouse, giving him a points total of 200 to become the leader in the clubhouse. Next in was our Handicap Secretary and 4-time Champion Dave Johnstone, who carded 32 points, giving him a total of 199 points and as it stood second in the championship. Third in the clubhouse was our very own Silver Ferret Mick Fullwood, Mick had carded a total of 34 points, giving him a total of 201 championship points, which was enough to make him the championship leader in the clubhouse, pipping Daniel Keen by one point. The penultimate member in the clubhouse was our Chairman and 4-time champion Mick O'Hanlon. Mick handed his card in, he had scored a total of 32 points, this was only enough to secure himself fourth place behind Mick Fullwood, Daniel Keen and Dave Johnstone respectively. The only possible challenger now to Mick Fullwood who was the leader in the clubhouse was our Vice-Captain Daniel O'Hanlon. Had Daniel done enough over the last few holes? Daniel had 175 points prior to the final championship match at Springwater and Mick was in the clubhouse with 201 points, so it didn't take much to work out what was needed. But, of course Daniel was out on the course still and did not know what was leading in the clubhouse. Daniel O'Hanlon finished the 18<sup>th</sup> hole and had come off with a gross bogey for 2 points. Would

those 2 points prove crucial in his quest for his first ever WAGS championship? Well....

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Well, yes it had! Daniel came in with a total of 34 points, giving him a total for the championship of 209 points, meaning he had won the championship by 8 points from Mick Fullwood.

Daniel very well played indeed on securing your first WAGS championship.

Daniel's average points score over the season was 32.63 per match and was the highest for anyone playing more than one match. So, I think Daniel had well and truly earned his first championship.
